KARE - Programs

Home Repairs and Weatherization

KARE partners with other agencies to help provide safe living conditions for low-income, senior, or disabled homeowners.



Food Pantry- provides low-income families with well-balanced, nutritional food that supplement a minimum of 1 weeks' household grocery expenses.

Crisis Assistance

Provides clients that are experiencing short-term crisis situations, with assistance maintaining their most basic needs as well as counseling services. KARE is here to walk with our clients during their crisis and help them build the skills needed to maintain or regain financial independence.



The Exchange-

KARE's community thrift store is open to the general public and provides all shoppers the opportunity to find great buys while saving money in their pockets and supporting a great cause.



Community Impact

- \$59,686.71 financial assistance provided to 289 households
- 155 clients received Financial Counseling
- 251 referrals to partner agencies for additional support
- 11 homes repaired (4 heating units, 5 ramps, 2 porches)
- 42 Duke Weatherization projects completed
- 3,177 households received 554,049lbs of food assistance
- 4,679 households received food assistance through partner agencies where KARE provided 53,584 lbs of food.
- 8,681 volunteer hours donated to KARE
- 291,429 lbs of food donated to KARE
